In Memoriam For Wind Ensemble

A musical composition has never been written for a musical ensemble at Clearview High School. This evening the high school concert band is honored to perform *In Memoriam For Wind Ensemble* composed by Mr. Bruce Yurko.

As the title suggests, the composition is an elegy. Unfortunately, this elegy is written for the memory of our dear friend, and former band member, Kristina Damm. Kristina died on July 29, 1995 after she was struck by lightning.

As well as being fully active with the Clearview Band program, Kristina also took private French Horn lessons with Mr. Yurko. Within one week of hearing of the tragedy, Bruce called me and said, "I've written an elegy for Kristina."

The piece begins with the metallic percussion instruments, ie. Bells, Chimes, and Vibraphone, along with piano, in a dissonant four note phrase. Mr. Yurko likened it to, the saddest phone call that he had ever gotten. Appropriately, the first wind instrument to be heard in the piece is, a solo French Horn.
